credibility?	Determining Credibility: Look at the author's background, publication's reputation, and quality of evidence.
What are common	
misconceptions?	Common Misconceptions: All sources are credible; challenging claims means dismissing them.
How to challenge claims	
effectively?	Effective Challenging: Engage critically by questioning and corroborating information, not just rejecting it.
