Cues	Notes
Figurative Language	Figurative language includes metaphors, similes, and personification.
Connotative Meaning	Connotative meanings are the emotions or associations a word carries beyond its literal meaning.
Context Clues	Context clues help determine the meaning of a word based on the
Multiple Meanings	surrounding text.
Tone	Many words have multiple meanings that change depending on context.
	Tone is the author's attitude toward the subject, conveyed through word choice.
