Cues	Notes
What is satire?	Satire uses humor, irony, or ridicule to criticize.
How to identify sarcasm?	Sarcasm involves saying the opposite of what one means.
Examples of irony?	Irony occurs when there's a contrast between expectation and reality.
What is understatement?	Understatement makes a situation seem less important than it is.
