Today's Standard

Cues	Notes
What is relevant information?	Relevant information directly supports the topic and is significant to the audience.
Why is audience knowledge important?	Understanding the audience's knowledge helps tailor content to be engaging and informative.
How to evaluate sources?	Evaluating sources involves checking credibility, relevance, and accuracy.
What are common	Evaluating sources involves checking credibility, relevance, and accuracy.
misconceptions?	Common misconceptions include adding too much irrelevant information and using complex jargon unnecessarily.
