Cues	Notes
What are credible sources?	Credible sources include peer-reviewed journals, books by reputable authors, and official publications.
How to perform advanced searches?	Advanced searches involve using specific keywords, Boolean operators, and filters.
Why is it important to assess source strengths and limitations?	Assessing source strengths and limitations helps ensure the information is relevant and reliable for the task.
What is plagiarism?	Plagiarism is using someone else's work without giving proper credit.
How to cite sources properly?	Proper citation involves following a standard format like APA, MLA, or Chicago to give credit to the original authors.
