Cues	Notes
What are common nouns?	Common nouns are general names for things, e.g., 'dog', 'city'.
What are proper nouns?	Proper nouns are specific names and always start with a capital letter, e.g., 'Rover', 'New York'.
What are possessive nouns?	Possessive nouns show ownership, e.g., 'dog's bone', 'city's mayor'.
Examples of each type of noun	Examples: Common - 'cat', Proper - 'Mr. Whiskers', Possessive - 'cat's toy'.
