What are personal pronouns?	Personal pronouns replace specific people or things (e.g., I, you, he).
What are possessive pronouns?	Possessive pronouns show ownership (e.g., my, your, their).
What are indefinite pronouns?	Indefinite pronouns refer to non-specific things or people (e.g., anyone, everything).
How do pronouns help in sentences?	Pronouns make sentences less repetitive and clearer.
What are common mistakes with pronouns?	Common mistakes include confusing possessive pronouns with contractions and overusing indefinite pronouns.
