What are the types of sentences?	There are four types of sentences: declarative, interrogative, imperative, and exclamatory.
How do you identify a declarative sentence?	A declarative sentence makes a statement and ends with a period.
	An interrogative sentence asks a question and ends with a question mark.
What is an interrogative	
sentence?	A compound sentence is made up of two simple sentences joined by a conjunction.
How do you form a compound	
sentence?	Conjunctions like 'and', 'but', and 'or' connect clauses in compound sentences.
What role do conjunctions play in sentences?
