What is categorization?	Categorization is grouping words based on shared characteristics.
Why is sorting words important?	Sorting words helps students understand relationships between concepts.
	Examples of categories include colors, clothing, animals, and foods.
What are examples of categories?	A common misconception is that any word can fit into any category.
What is a common misconception about categorization?	Overlapping categories can be explained by showing that some words fit into multiple groups based on different criteria.
How can overlapping categories be explained?
