What are conjunctions?	Conjunctions are words that connect ideas in a sentence.
How do we use 'because'?	'Because' is used to explain why something happens.
Examples of conjunctions	Examples: and, because, but, or.
Why are conjunctions important?	Conjunctions help us make our sentences more detailed and clear.
