What is length?	Length is the measurement of something from end to end.
How do we compare lengths?	We compare lengths by placing objects side by side or using a third object to compare two items indirectly.
Why use a third object?	Using a third object helps ensure accurate comparison by providing a
Common misconceptions	consistent reference point.
Real-world applications	Misconception: Visual estimation is accurate. Reality: Measuring provides consistency.
	Examples: Comparing pencils, strings, and books in the classroom.
