Telling Time to Half-Hours

Today's Standard

1.MD.B3 - Tell and write time in hours and half-hours using analog and digital clocks.

Cues	Notes
What is the standard?	The standard is about telling and writing time in hours and half-hours using analog and digital clocks.
What are the prerequisite skills?	
What are common misconceptions?	Students should know how to count up to 12, recognize numbers on a clock, and understand basic time intervals.
What interventions can help?	Common misconceptions include confusing the hour and minute hands and thinking the time changes only when the minute hand points directly at a number.
What is the subsequent knowledge?	Interventions include using color-coding for clock hands and practicing with times when the minute hand is between numbers.
	Subsequent knowledge includes telling time to the nearest five minutes, understanding AM and PM, and solving real-world time problems.

Summary

This standard teaches students to tell and write time in hours and half-hours using analog and digital clocks. Key skills include recognizing clock numbers and understanding time intervals. Common misconceptions can be addressed with specific interventions, and mastering this standard leads to more advanced time-telling abilities.
