What is decoding?	Decoding is the ability to apply knowledge of letter-sound relationships to correctly pronounce written words.
Why is decoding important?	confectly promounce written words.
What are one-syllable words?	Decoding helps students read fluently and understand text, laying the groundwork for more advanced reading skills.
What are common misconceptions?	One-syllable words are words that consist of only one syllable, such as 'cat', 'dog', and 'hat'.
How can we practice decoding?	Common misconceptions include thinking all one-syllable words follow the same rules and equating decoding with memorization.
	Practice decoding through phonics games, reading aloud, and interactive activities.
