Counting Syllables in Words

What is a syllable?	A syllable is a unit of sound in a word that has one vowel sound.
Why must every syllable have a vowel sound?	Every syllable must have a vowel sound because vowels are the core of syllables.
How do you determine the number of syllables in a word?	To determine the number of syllables, count the vowel sounds in the word.
What are common misconceptions about syllables?	Common misconceptions include thinking every letter has a vowel sound and that silent 'e' adds a syllable.
How can you correct these misconceptions?	Use visual aids, hands-on activities, and practice to correct misconceptions.
