Cues	Notes
What is a syllable?	A syllable is a unit of pronunciation having one vowel sound.
How do you break a word into syllables?	To break a word into syllables, identify the vowel sounds and use rules like V/CV and VC/CV patterns.
Examples of two-syllable words	Examples: 'kit-ten', 'hap-py', 'ta-ble', 'li-on', 'po-em'.
Common syllable patterns	Common patterns: V/CV (e.g., 'ta-ble'), VC/CV (e.g., 'kit-ten').
Why is syllable segmentation important?	Syllable segmentation helps in decoding longer words and improves reading fluency.
