Why are inflectional endings	
important?	They help readers understand how words change to convey different meanings.
Common mistakes with	
inflectional endings	Students may think the root word changes completely or struggle with pronunciation.
How to practice inflectional	
endings	Practice through reading, writing, and phonics exercises.
