| What is context? | Context refers to the words and sentences around a particular word that help clarify its meaning. |
| Why is rereading important? | Rereading helps improve comprehension and allows students to catch details they may have missed the first time. |
| How can context help with word recognition? | Context can provide clues about the meaning of unfamiliar words, helping readers make more accurate guesses. |
| What is a common misconception about word guessing? | Some students think they can guess a word based on its first letter, but this often leads to mistakes. |
| What is a common misconception about rereading? | Some students believe they only need to read a sentence once to understand it, but rereading can enhance understanding. |
