What is the standard 1.RI.3?	Standard 1.RI.3 focuses on describing connections between individuals, events, ideas, or pieces of information in a text.
How do you describe	
connections in a text?	To describe connections, look for relationships like cause and effect, comparisons, and sequences.
Why are connections	
important?	Connections help deepen understanding and make the information more meaningful.
What are common	
misconceptions?	Common misconceptions include thinking all connections are equally significant and that they are always explicitly stated.
How can you find implied	
connections?	Implied connections require inference, looking beyond the text for deeper meaning.
