Cues	Notes
What is a narrator?	A narrator is the person or character who tells the story.
How can you identify the narrator?	Look for clues in the text, such as who is speaking or whose thoughts are being shared.
What is the difference between a narrator and a main character?	The narrator tells the story, while the main character is the central figure in the story's events.
Can the narrator be the author?	The narrator can be a fictional character created by the author, not necessarily the author themselves.
Why is identifying the narrator important?	Identifying the narrator helps understand the story's perspective and meaning.

Summary

Understanding who the narrator is in a story helps students comprehend the story's perspective and meaning. The narrator can be identified through textual clues and is different from the main character and the author.
