What are reflexive pronouns?	Reflexive pronouns refer back to the subject of the sentence.
How do reflexive pronouns function in a sentence?	They are used when the subject and the object of the sentence are the same.
Examples of reflexive pronouns.	Examples include myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves, and themselves.
Common mistakes with reflexive pronouns.	Common mistakes include using reflexive pronouns in place of regular pronouns.
How to correct misuse of reflexive pronouns?	To correct misuse, ensure the pronoun refers back to the subject and is necessary for the meaning of the sentence.
