What is a simple sentence?	A simple sentence has one subject and one verb.
What is a compound sentence?	A compound sentence has two independent clauses joined by a conjunction.
How can we expand a sentence?	
Why might we rearrange a sentence?	We can expand a sentence by adding adjectives, adverbs, or additional clauses.
	Rearranging a sentence can improve clarity, emphasis, or flow.
What are common	
misconceptions about sentences?	Misconception 1: All sentences should be short. Misconception 2: Rearranging sentences changes their meaning.
