What is the purpose of reading?	Reading is not just about saying the words but understanding the meaning behind them.
How can we understand what	
we read?	To understand what we read, we should ask questions, look for context clues, and summarize in our own words.
What should we do if we don't	
understand a text?	If we don't understand a text, we should slow down, re-read, and ask questions.
Why is it important to read with	
purpose?	Reading with purpose helps us focus and makes it easier to understand the text.
What are common	
misconceptions about reading?	Common misconceptions include thinking that reading quickly is more important than understanding and that understanding words is enough without grasping the overall meaning.
