Cues	Notes
What is point of view?	Point of view is the perspective from which a story is told.
Why use different voices?	Using different voices helps distinguish characters and makes the story more engaging.
How to recognize character	
perspectives?	Recognize character perspectives by paying attention to their thoughts, feelings, and actions.
Examples of different	
perspectives?	Examples: In 'The Three Little Pigs,' each pig has a different view on building houses.
How does this help in reading?	
	Understanding different perspectives helps with comprehension and empathy.
