Today's Standard

Cues	Notes
What are collaborative conversations?	Collaborative conversations involve sharing ideas and listening to others.
Why are they important?	They help develop communication skills and enhance learning.
How can students participate?	Students can participate by sharing thoughts, asking questions, and building on others' ideas.
What are common misconceptions?	Misconception 1: Only speak when asked. Misconception 2: Different opinions are not important.
What are effective interventions?	Interventions include encouraging active participation and valuing diverse opinions.
