What is an opinion piece?	An opinion piece is a type of writing where the author states their opinion on a topic and provides reasons to support it.
Why are reasons important?	
What are linking words?	Reasons are important because they help to persuade the reader and provide evidence for the opinion.
Why is a conclusion necessary?	Linking words (e.g., because, and, also) help to connect the opinion with the reasons and make the writing flow better.
	A conclusion is necessary to summarize the opinion and reasons, reinforcing the main points of the writing.

Summary
