What is an informative text?	Informative texts provide factual information on a topic.

How can we distinguish between facts and opinions?	Facts are statements that can be proven true, while opinions are personal beliefs or feelings.
What are some real-world applications of informative writing?	Real-world applications include writing reports, creating informational posters, and composing 'how-to' guides.
