What is a narrative?	A narrative is a story that recounts events.
Why are details important in a story?	Details help to describe actions, thoughts, and feelings, making the story more engaging.
What are temporal words?	Temporal words signal the order of events (e.g., first, next, then, finally).
How do you provide a sense of closure?	A sense of closure helps to conclude the story and wrap up the events.
