What is a plural noun?	A plural noun refers to more than one person, place, thing, or idea.

What are irregular plural nouns?	Irregular plural nouns do not follow standard rules and change form, like 'foot' to 'feet'.
Why is it important to know plural nouns?	Knowing plural nouns helps in writing and speaking accurately.
Examples of irregular plural nouns	Examples include 'child' to 'children', 'mouse' to 'mice', and 'tooth' to 'teeth'.
