What are coordinating conjunctions?	Coordinating conjunctions connect words, phrases, and clauses of equal importance (e.g., and, but, or).
What are subordinating conjunctions?	Subordinating conjunctions connect a dependent clause to an independent clause (e.g., because, although, since).
Why use conjunctions?	Using conjunctions helps create complex sentences and improve writing clarity.
Examples of conjunctions	Examples: and, but, or, because, although, since.
Common mistakes with conjunctions	Common mistakes include using conjunctions interchangeably and thinking they can only start sentences.
