Conventional Spelling and Suffixes

What is conventional spelling?	Conventional spelling refers to the standard way of spelling words correctly.
What are high-frequency words?	High-frequency words are words that appear often in written text.
What are suffixes?	Suffixes are letters added to the end of a word to change its meaning.
How do you add suffixes to base words?	Adding suffixes involves specific rules, such as dropping the 'e' in 'smile' to form 'smiled'.
What are common mistakes in adding suffixes?	Common mistakes include incorrect changes to base words, such as always changing 'y' to 'ies'.
