| What is an affix?                                  | An affix is a prefix or suffix added to a root word.                    |
| How do prefixes and suffixes change word meanings? | Prefixes and suffixes can change the meaning of a root word completely. |
|  | Example: 'agreeable' becomes 'disagreeable' with the prefix 'dis-'.     |
| Examples of prefix changes                         | Example: 'care' becomes 'careless' with the suffix '-less'.             |
| Examples of suffix changes                         | Example. Care becomes careless with the suffix riess.                   |
