Literal vs. Nonliteral Meanings

Cues	Notes
Literal Meaning	Literal meaning: The exact, dictionary definition of a word or phrase.
Nonliteral Meaning	Nonliteral meaning: A meaning that is different from the exact, dictionary definition, often figurative or symbolic.
Context Clues	Context clues: Hints or information provided within a sentence or passage
Idioms	that help clarify the meaning of a word or phrase.
Figurative Language	Idioms: Phrases where the meaning is not deducible from the literal words (e.g., 'break the ice').
	Figurative language: Language that uses words or expressions with meanings different from the literal interpretation.

Understanding the difference between literal and nonliteral meanings helps in interpreting figurative language and enhances reading comprehension.
