What is the main idea?	Understanding relationships in text helps in comprehending the material.
How are events related?	Events, ideas, or steps are often connected through time, sequence, or cause/effect.
What is cause and effect?	
	Cause and effect explain why something happens and the result.
What are transitional words?	
	Transitional words like 'first', 'next', 'then', and 'finally' help in sequencing.
How do you sequence steps?	
	Sequencing steps correctly ensures the process or story makes sense.
