What is literal language?	Literal language means exactly what it says.
What is nonliteral language?	Nonliteral language uses words in a way that is different from their usual meaning.
Examples of idioms	Idiama are physical with machines different from the literal machines of
How to identify metaphors	Idioms are phrases with meanings different from the literal meanings of the individual words.
Why is understanding figurative language important?	Metaphors compare two things without using 'like' or 'as'.
	Understanding figurative language helps in interpreting deeper meanings in texts.
