What are common	
misconceptions?	Common misconceptions include thinking an opinion alone is enough and using irrelevant reasons.
How can we address	
misconceptions?	Use graphic organizers and practice evaluating reasons to address misconceptions.
What will students learn next?	
	Students will progress to writing more detailed opinion pieces with evidence.
