What is a complete sentence?	A complete sentence has a subject and a predicate and expresses a complete thought.
What are sentence fragments?	
What are run-on sentences?	Sentence fragments are incomplete sentences that lack either a subject or a predicate.
How can you fix a sentence fragment?	Run-on sentences are improperly joined independent clauses that can confuse the reader.
How can you fix a run-on sentence?	To fix a sentence fragment, add the missing subject or predicate to make it a complete thought.
	To fix a run-on sentence, use a conjunction or proper punctuation like a semicolon.
