What are homophones?	Homophones are words that sound the same but have different meanings and spellings.
Examples of confused words	Examples: to, too, two; there, their, they're.
Why is it important to use the correct word?	Using the correct word ensures clear communication and avoids misunderstandings.
How can we remember the differences?	Mnemonic devices and context clues can help remember the differences.
