Cues	Notes
What is an inference?	Inference: A conclusion drawn from evidence and reasoning.
How do you find explicit details?	Explicit details: Directly stated information in the text.
Why are text details important?	Text details help explain what is explicitly stated and support inferences.
Can you give an example of an inference?	Example: If a character is crying, we can infer they are sad.
What is the difference between explicit and inferred information?	Explicit information is directly stated; inferred information is derived from clues.
