Cues	Notes
Point of View	Point of view is the perspective from which a story is told.
First-Person Narration	First-person narration uses 'I' or 'we' and is told from the narrator's perspective.
Third-Person Narration	Third-person narration uses 'he,' 'she,' 'they' and is told from an outside perspective.
Narrator vs. Author	
Influence on Story	The narrator is a character created by the author to tell the story. The point of view can change how readers interpret events and characters.

Summary

Understanding different points of view in narration helps students analyze how stories are told and how they perceive the events and characters. This skill is crucial for deeper literary analysis.
