What are collaborative discussions?	Collaborative discussions involve sharing ideas and building knowledge together.
Why is it important to listen to others?	Listening to others helps us understand different perspectives and learn new things.
How can we build on others' ideas?	We can build on others' ideas by adding our thoughts, asking questions, and making connections.
What are common misconceptions about discussions?	Misconception 1: Only my ideas are correct. Misconception 2: Discussions are about winning arguments.
What skills will we develop after mastering this standard?	We will develop persuasive speaking and critical evaluation skills.
