Cues	Notes
What is the importance of preparation?	Preparation ensures meaningful contributions.
How can students prepare for discussions?	Read required material, make notes, summarize key points.
What are common misconceptions?	Misconceptions: No need for preparation, relying on prior knowledge.
How can misconceptions be addressed?	Use checklists, integrate new material, structured note-taking.
What skills are developed through prepared discussions?	Develops critical thinking, collaboration, and evaluation skills.
