What is an opinion piece?	An opinion piece expresses a viewpoint on a topic or text.
Why is supporting evidence important?	Supporting evidence makes the opinion more convincing and credible.
How do you structure an opinion piece?	Structure: Introduction with opinion, body paragraphs with reasons and evidence, conclusion.
	Misconceptions: Opinion alone is enough; any reason is sufficient.
What are common	
misconceptions?	Strengthen reasons by ensuring they are relevant and well-supported by evidence.
