What is narrative writing?	Narrative writing tells a story with a clear sequence of events.
How do you introduce characters?	Introduce characters by weaving them into the story context.

Why is organization important in a story?	Organization helps the reader follow the story and understand the plot.
What are common transitional words?	Common transitional words include 'then', 'next', 'after', 'finally'.
