What is plagiarism?	To evaluate a source, check the author's credentials, publication date, and cross-reference with other reliable sources.
Why is paraphrasing important?	Plagiarism is using someone else's work without giving proper credit.
What skills are developed through research projects?	Paraphrasing is important to show understanding and avoid plagiarism.
	Research projects help develop skills in information organization, presentation, and citation.
