Notes
Text evidence is information from a text that supports your analysis.
Text evidence makes your arguments stronger and more credible.
To cite text evidence, use direct quotes, paraphrases, or summaries with clear references to the source.
Direct quotes are exact words taken from the text and put in quotation marks.
Paraphrasing is rephrasing the text in your own words while keeping the original meaning.
