What is figurative language?	Figurative language uses creative expressions to convey meanings different from the literal words.
Examples of figurative language	
What are word relationships?	Examples include similes, metaphors, idioms, and puns.
what are word relationships:	Word relationships refer to how words are connected, such as synonyms
Examples of word relationships	and antonyms.
What are nuances in word meanings?	Examples include happy/sad (antonyms) and happy/joyful (synonyms).
_	Nuances in word meanings refer to subtle differences in meaning or usage.
