What are letter-sound correspondences?	Letter-sound correspondences: Relationship between letters and their sounds.
What are syllabication patterns?	Syllabication patterns: Rules for dividing words into syllables.
What is morphology?	Morphology: Study of word parts like roots and affixes.
How do these skills help in reading?	These skills help decode unfamiliar multisyllabic words.
What are common misconceptions?	Misconceptions: Each letter has a single sound; syllabication is unnecessary.
