What are context clues?	Context clues are hints found within a sentence or paragraph that help readers understand the meaning of unfamiliar words.
How do context clues help in	
reading?	They assist in word recognition and comprehension by providing additional information that can lead to understanding.
What should you do if context	
clues are not enough?	If context clues are insufficient, use other strategies such as looking up the word, asking for help, or using a dictionary.

	Rereading helps clarify understanding and is a strategy used by proficient
