Cues	Notes
Key figures	Key figures in a text often have relationships that are not explicitly stated.
Cause and effect	Cause and effect is one type of relationship, but not the only one.
Text structures	Texts can follow various structures like compare and contrast, problem and solution.
Implicit relationships	Implicit relationships require inferencing skills.
Context clues	Context clues help in understanding implicit relationships.
