What are text structures?	Text structures are the ways in which information is organized in a text.
Why is it important to compare text structures?	Comparing text structures helps in understanding and analyzing the information more effectively.
What are common text structures?	Common text structures include chronology, comparison, cause/effect, and problem/solution.
How does structure affect meaning?	The structure of a text can affect its clarity, meaning, and effectiveness.
Examples of text structures	Examples: Chronology in history books, cause/effect in scientific reports, problem/solution in instructional manuals.
